- a) Comment on the seasonal opening as depicted by Chaucer in *Prologue to the Canterbury Tales*.
- b) Briefly comment on the ill practices of the Summoner.
- c) Comment on the line – "It is a star to every wandering bark."
- d) Pick out any two sensuous images from the opening stanza of Donne's "The Extasie" and briefly explain them.

- e) Explain the metaphor in the line – "Else a great prince in prison lies."
- f) Comment on – "Amphibious thing! That acting either part,
The trifling head or the corrupted heart!"
- g) Comment on the first two lines of "Epistle to Dr. Arbuthnot".

Only that she might laurel grow."

3. Answer any four of the following : 2 x 4

- a) What is the proposal of the Host in Chaucer's *Prologue*?
- b) "My wit is short, ye may wel understonde." – Explain.
- c) What do you mean by 'canker bloom' in Shakespeare's Sonnet No. 54.
- d) Explain the note of contrast in Shakespeare's Sonnet No. 18.
- e) "Our blood labours to beget / spirits . . ." – Explain the idea.
- f) Who is Codrus? Why does Pope use the name in "Epistle to Dr. Arbuthnot"?
- g) What does Blake mean by "forests of the night"?
- h) What is meant by "happy garden-state"?
