- (e) Under what title were Coleridge's lectures on Shakespeare published and when?
- (f) What does Stephen Greenblatt examine in 'Tyrant'?
- (g) Mention and briefly explain at least two faults of Shakespeare, as pointed out by Dr. Johnson.
- (h) What does G. Wilson Knight think of 'atmosphere' in a typical Shakespearean tragedy?

## 2. Attempt any four of the following: $4 \times 4$

- a) Give a description of the structure of Elizabethan theatre.
- b) "To whom should I complain? Did I tell this who would believe me!" Explain.
- c) Why is the play within a play significant in *Hamlet*?
- d) Comment on Coleridge's analysis of Macbeth.
- e) How does Dr. Johnson defend the three Unities?
- f) What is Greenblatt's opinion of Shakespeare's dealing with politics in some of his plays?
- g) Comment on G. Wilson Knight's emphasis on 'interpretation' rather than 'criticism' of Shakespeare.
- h) Analyse the role of Lucio in Measure for Measure.

# 3. Answer any two of the following : $2 \times 8$

- a) How does Orson Wells present the Witches in his production of "Voodoo" *Macbeth* (1936)?
- b) Examine the appropriateness of the title *Measure* for *Measure*.
- c) Comment on Shakespeare's presentation of the Ghost in *Hamlet*.
- d) Attempt a study of Bradley's deliberations on the Hegelian theory of tragedy concerning thesis, antithesis and synthesis.
